Gray arrested on domestic battery and on an active and outstanding arrest warrant!

While talking to Santacroce, I noticed she had some redness on her bicep area just above her elbow. Santacroce refused any medical aid. Santacroce told me she desired prosecution against Gray for the domestic violence and she was willing to testify in court proceedings against him. I later asked Santacroce if she required an emergency protective order to which she told me yes. I later obtained an Emergency Protective Order from Judge Sterling with Santacroce as the protected and Gray as the restrained person.

After talking to the involved parties, I went outside and spoke to Gray's friend (Russell Betts). Betts told me he received several text messages from Santacroce in reference to the dispute between her and Gray. I asked Betts if he would allow me to see the text messages and take digital photographs of them, to which he agreed. One of the text messages from Santacroce to Betts read "Hes screwing up yet again, done" and another read "maybe his wake up call" and another said "He will taken away I really do not need this now I will call the Police" as well

one stating "Please find a place for him". Betts said he responded to her by texting her not to use the Police as a counselor, telling her "You guys need to work this out". I asked Betts if he would be a witness to the text messages to which he agreed.

I was then informed by the on duty dispatcher that Gray had a confirmed active arrest warrant. I went back inside and spoke with Gray. I informed Gray of the warrant and arrested him for the active arrest warrant. I then informed him he would be interviewed by Detective Essex at the Desert Hot Springs Police Department in reference the domestic violence (See Det. Essex' supplemental report).

Gray was transported to the Desert Hot Springs Police Department for further booking and interview with Det. Essex. While at the station, Detective Essex read Gray his rights from a department Miranda advisement form. Based on the victim's demeanor, the redness on her right arm, and on statements made by both parties, once Detective Essex concluded his interview with Gray, he was subsequently arrested for the domestic violence against Santacroce.

Gray then began to complain of stomach pain. He refused any medical aid but continued to have complaints of a stomach ache while in the DHSPD booking area. I contacted the on duty dispatcher to have medical aid respond to the Desert Hot Springs Police Department. DHS Fire truck #37 arrived on scene and firefighter Derek McGill checked Gray for his complaint of stomach pain. I later photographed Gray's stomach area but was unable to see any redness or bruising.

Ofc. Blum later transported Gray to Desert Regional Medical Center due to his complaint of pain. Once cleared from DRMC, Ofc. Blum transported Gray to the Riverside County Banning Jail for booking on the listed charge. Prior to being transported I gave Gray a citation with a new court date for his active arrest warrant.

Santacroce said she has two children who live in the home with her and Gray. Based on the fact there was a domestic violence incident in the home, I contacted the Riverside County Child Protective Services and spoke with Chrysa Williams. Williams gave me a reference number of 0047-8379-4648-2032943.
