
General Plan Update - Where Do We Grow From Here?

"The City of Desert Hot Springs is committed to becoming a world-class health and wellness

destination based on its famous miracle waters, unique desert ecosystem, spectacular mountain views and natural environment. The City is dedicated to improving the quality of life and economic opportunities for its residents, while preserving community and family values, encouraging social and cultural diversity and increasing recreational opportunities."



The importance is implicit in the phrase, "The City of Desert Hot Springs is committed to" Not only was the statement formulated through interaction with a citizen advisory group but also members of staff and the City Council. The words reflect a consensus achieved through the hard work of a diverse group of people, and spell out what are believed to be the priorities that will drive
